## What happened to the old skatepark?

It was removed in the Spring of 2020 and reverted back to an empty asphalt lot due to safety concerns relating to the construction and deteriorated condition of the park.

# What is the current status of the project?

We can proudly say that the project is approaching build-ready status. Below are some of the key points:

- The land for the park has been formally committed to being used for the project
- Creative and technical engineering designs for the park are complete
- Required surveys and environmental reviews for the project are complete
- A building permit is currently in review with the County of San Luis Obispo
- Over 60% of the funding required to complete the project has already been raised and there is a large grant application under review that could cover the remainder/match grant with OGALS
- Project has passed CEQA requirements as of 7/20/2023

#### What still needs to be done?

After over 3 years of sustained community effort there are just a few major milestones remaining:

- Official approval of the building permit by San Luis Obispo County
- Completion of fundraising campaign
- Selection of a construction firm- RFP
- Construction of the park!

# How much is this going to cost?

The current estimate for the project is \$1,020,461, which will include construction of approximately 6,000 square feet of skating area, a single stall restroom, paved parking lot, and various other site improvements including a retaining wall, sidewalk/curb, and storm water management infrastructure. While this may seem like a lot, the project has already raised \$625,000 and there is a clear plan for raising the rest of the funding needed to complete the project.

### How is the project being funded?

Funding for the project comes from three primary sources: money committed by CCSD, money raised by Skate Cambria through public donations, merchandise sales, and events, and finally money available through various grant opportunities.

### When will the project be completed?

If all goes according to the proposed schedule, the park will be completed in mid 2025.

### Where is the new skatepark being built?

At the same location as the old skatepark, across the street from the Vet's Hall and next to the library.

# Why should I care about this project if I don't skateboard?

Beyond just a skatepark, this project will create a youth friendly space in Cambria where people can gather and connect. It will help bring vibrancy to Cambria's downtown and will be a space that is welcoming to both locals and visitors.

In addition to skateboarding, the park will create a space for other wheeled sports including scooters, roller skates, rollerblades, and even wheelchairs.

## What will the new skatepark be like?

The skatepark will have a mix of street and transition features that will support skaters with a range of interests and abilities. The park will be constructed as a modern concrete skatepark that requires little maintenance, and will last for generations to come.

## What will be the hours of operation?

The park will be open from dawn till dusk 365 days a year.

#### Who is Skate Cambria?

Skate Cambria is a community group of youth, parents, and other local skaters that have banded together with the mission of rebuilding the Cambria skatepark.

#### Are donations tax deductible?

Yes, Cambria Community Council has stepped in as Skate Cambria's fiscal agent /501 c(3) so all donations are tax deductible.
